Christmas - Know the main features of the story of Christmas and discuss some of the images of Jesus found in the Gospel of St. John. Talk about some reasons why Christmas is an important celebration in the life of the Church.

Followers of Christ - Know that Jesus called many people to follow him and identify reasons why these people responded to his call. Understand that following Christ sometimes demands sacrifices and identify some vocations that exist in the life of the Church.

Lent - Understand some reasons why Jesus spoke of prayer, fasting and almsgiving being important and think about applying these in their own lives. Discuss issues concerning poverty in the world today and think about some remedies for this problem.

Holy Week - Imagine some of the thoughts and feelings of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane and think of some reasons why Peter denied Jesus. Understand why the death of Jesus has been described as a sacrifice.

Geography.

World War II and Its Impact - Pupils will develop their geographical understanding through the study of World War II, exploring the countries involved and how the conflict reshaped Europe and the wider world. They will strengthen their map-reading skills by using four and six-figure grid references to identify key locations of strategic importance. Through investigations of human and physical geography, pupils will examine how the war changed landscapes, settlements and land use across the West Midlands, the UK and Europe. They will also undertake a comparative study of the West Midlands and Honolulu, Hawaii, analysing how wartime events affected these contrasting locations and communities.



History.

World War II – Pupils will explore the causes, key events and impact of World War II, including life on the Home Front, the role of women, evacuation, rationing and the Holocaust. They will develop their chronological understanding, use historical enquiry skills to evaluate evidence, and consider how the war is remembered and why it remains significant today

Science

Our Changing World – we will learn about animal behaviour at different times of year, life cycles & adaption leading to evolution.

Everything Changes – we will learn about how living things vary, environment affecting plants, living things surviving and becoming extinct, scientific evidence for living things changing over time and natural selection.
