Friday is the anniversary of the first appearance of Our Lady at Lourdes and World Day of Prayer for the Sick.

This could also include family bereavement, the unexpected loss of a child or family member, the hurt of not being able to grieve or hold a Funeral Service during recent months. It will be possible to experience the compassion of Our Lord in a personal and individual way. The service is not intended to be Sacramental, during the preceding week there will opportunities for Confessions, and for the anointing of the sick. I hope that this will be helpful to all of us, that it may be an opening for people to return to religious practice and the life of our Parish community, and that we may be able to experience the joy of Our Lord's healing grace in our lives. As the weeks go on, further suggestions will be made but at the moment, we ask that this service is widely publicised, especially to those for whom it may offer hope and a chance of reconciliation with Our Lord, and our Parish.
