<p>Weekly Spelling Tasks: PRIORITY IN YEAR 1 (aim to do 1 per day)</p>	<p>Weekly Reading Tasks: (aim to do 1 per day)</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily phonics - your child to practice their sounds and blend words. See links for Phonics Screening. (30 minutes per day - can be broken up eg 3 x 10 minutes daily) • Spell the months of the year: • Spell common exception words on Spelling Shed. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book everyday. This can be reading a book aloud everyday or sharing a book with an adult. • Watch Newsround and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Is there anything you need help understanding? • Draw a story mountain: what happened in the beginning, middle, end? • Complete a book review on one of the books you have read - what did you like about it? Would you recommend it to anyone?
<p>Weekly Maths Tasks: (aim to do 1 per day)</p>	<p>Weekly Writing Tasks: (aim to do 1 per day)</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Addition and subtractions facts up to 20. • Comparing numbers using <, > or =. For example : $4 + 11 > 4 + 12$ • Maths Shed games. • Baking - using measures for ingredients. • Comparing lengths, longer, shorter, ordering objects from shortest to longest. • Days of the week, before, after. The day before Monday is? etc 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diary: Write about your day. Include adjectives and time words to make sentences interesting. • Write your address. Using capital letters for names of places, set out address correctly. Discuss any famous addresses; Buckingham Palace, 10 Downing Street. • Write a letters to the Queen. What would you like to ask her? • Write a letter or postcard to your teacher.
<p>Weekly RE Tasks: (aim to do 1 per week)</p>	<p>Alternative Activities: (aim to do 1 per week)</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Share a bible story. What does it teach us? • Re-write the story and draw a picture to illustrate. • Imagine you can speak to a person in the story and write some questions for them. • 	<p>My house: Discuss with your child what their house looks like inside and outside? How many bedrooms does it have? Who has the biggest bedroom? Who has the smallest? Ask them to look outside their window and see if they can spot a house different to their own.
